
### **April Concert Highlights**

### Mozart's Sinfonia Concertante for Violin, Viola, and Orchestra Kristina Anderson, violin Holly Barnes, viola

**Kristina Anderson** has been concertmaster for several orchestras, including Livermore-Amador Symphony (since 2008), Diablo Symphony, West Bay Opera Orchestra, and Santa Cruz Symphony. She has also performed as violin soloist with the Livermore-Amador, Diablo, and Santa Cruz symphonies.

**Holly Barnes** has performed with a number of orchestras in the Boston area over the past 25 years. She is currently assistant principal viola of the Boston Ballet Orchestra. Ms. Barnes previously performed with Livermore-Amador Symphony in 2002.

The main purpose of the meeting is to elect new Association Board directors. All Association members are encouraged to attend the meeting and vote in the election.

As required by the Association bylaws, the Board comprises 20–30 members (40–60% of whom are orchestra players) who all volunteer their time on the Board. The Guild president is a director *ex officio*; all others are elected to serve three-year terms, beginning July  $1^{st}$  of a given year.
