Symphony President Alan Frank's Note

We are tuning our way back!

The good news is that we still have an orchestra and are now confidently planning the return to a normal season. Our musicians are anxious to make music together. Over the summer we will have readings of music planned for the season. A recent survey of our musicians indicated that only about four members would not be returning this fall, comparable to our normal turn-over. More good news—thanks to our Guild, donors, and members of our audience who have supported the symphony over the years, we are in sound shape financially.

On Tuesday, June 15, most of the members of the orchestra met on the stage of the Bankhead theater for a reading of Dvorak's *New World* Symphony. It was a thoroughly uplifting experience and a chance for our musicians to shake out the cobwebs.

There were a few complaints of sore wrists, shoulders, lips, or lungs from those who might not have had their instrument out of the case for fifteen months. When we finished, despite a few wrong notes and missed cues, there was a rousing cheer as everyone was delighted to be back making music again.
