APRIL 23 CONCERT FEATURED PERFORMERS

Nature, eternity and democracy. The remarkable words of two iconic Americans, poet Emily Dickinson and President Abraham Lincoln, inspired Aaron Copland to set their powerful testaments to music. Soprano Heidi Moss Erickson and Narrator Faith Alpher join the symphony at the Bankhead Theater to bring these words to life in a program celebrating freedom, renewal, and hope.

Heidi Moss Erickson, Soprano Poems of Emily Dickinson

Our LAS audience may recognize **Heidi Moss Erickson**. She last performed with the Symphony in May 2016 in Samuel Barber's Knoxville: Summer of 1915. Moss Erickson and her husband composer Kurt Erickson also produced a special recital as a gift to the Symphony last season when we were not able to perform in-person. https://www.youtube.com/



watch?v=MCUT1U2om0w. She has performed with Opera Memphis, IVAI Italia, Opera Parallèle, Pocket Opera, Oakland Symphony, Livermore Valley Opera, and Opera San Jose, among numerous others. She holds a biology/music degree from Oberlin College, where she met fellow voice student Lara Webber. She holds a master's in biochemistry and was a research scientist before relocating to the Bay Area in 2003 and pursing a music career. She is a champion of new music and has collaborated with several renowned composers. She frequently collaborates with her husband and has premiered many of his works. In 2019 she was awarded the prestigious "Best in the Bay" award for her Richard Strauss recital featuring John Parr of Deutsche Oper Berlin at the piano. Moss Erickson has been interested in the science of singing ever since she came down with a rare facial paralysis in 2007.

Faith Alpher, Narrator Lincoln Portrait

Alpher is an actress, comedian, and Livermore local KKIQ radio personality. A native of Teaneck NJ, she has lived and worked in the Tri-Valley for over 20 years. She holds a master's degree in communication and has utilized her gifts to inspire people around the world through her comedy. Known for her quick wit and energy, Alpher writes curriculum



and speaks at high schools, colleges, universities, and businesses all over the country. She is also known for her ability to reach people across generations, cultures, and belief systems on an emotional level. Alpher has performed at the Bankhead several times, including her one-woman show, "Black Girl, Funny World," and in September 2021, "Got Faith."
