Program Notes

Symphony No. 3 in D Major, first movement Franz Schubert (1797–1828)

It took Schubert about ten days in 1815 to compose Symphony No. 3. Napoleon's occupation of Vienna had ended two years earlier, and musical performance in the town, especially by orchestras, was almost non-existent due to lack of energy and financial resources. Schubert never heard a professional performance of his nine symphonies, nor were they published during his lifetime. His family's string quartet, joined by friends who played winds and strings, would meet in a local merchant's large living room and play orchestral works, including the most recent symphonies by Schubert.

Karelia Suite Jean Sibelius (1865–1957)

Sibelius was a newly-established Finnish nationalistic composer when he was commissioned by the student union of the University of Helsinki to write music to accompany the staging of dramatic tableaux depicting the ancient Finnish region known as Karelia. Sibelius used three of the seven tableaux to create this orchestral suite. The Russian Empire was attempting to suppress the cultural heritage of its Grand Duchy of Finland as it sought to "Russify" Finland. The students' event was extremely successful. Finland eventually gained its independence from Russia in 1917.

Medley from La La Land

Justin Hurwitz (b. 1985)

The well-known and acclaimed musical romantic comedy La La Land was released in 2016. This story about the relationship between an aspiring actress and a jazz musician received fourteen Oscar nominations and won six awards. Hurwitz won the Academy Award for Original Score and another for Original Song ("The Fools Who Dream"). The music reflects the jazz style of the lead character and is often filled with the bittersweet atmosphere which characterizes much of the movie.

The medley includes the tunes "Another Day of Sun," "Mia and Sebastian's Theme," "The Fools Who Dream," and "City of Stars."

Traumbilder Fantasie Hans Christian Lumbye (1810–1874)

Lumbye was a Danish composer who wrote in the popular style of the day. He was known by the Austrians as the Johann Strauss of the North. The Danes retaliated by calling Strauss the Lumbye of the South. His waltzes, polkas, galops, and marches were extremely popular, and he often wrote pieces with catchy features such as the "Copenhagen Steam Railway Galop," which depicts a train chugging out of the station and eventually grinding to a halt. "Traumbilder" depicts a young girl's favorite things recalled in a dream: a flowery meadow, a glittering ballroom, a church festival, the Austrian Alps, and an encounter with a young man which does not resolve well. Her sadness is dispelled when she wakes up and realizes how deeply the heart can be moved in a dream.
