LAS May 20 Concert, "Drama and Fantasy" Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 3, John O'Conor, soloist

The internationally renowned pianist from Dublin, Ireland, John O'Conor, will perform with the symphony on the Bankhead stage at the May 20 concert. As LAS conductor and music director Lara Webber puts it, "We are thrilled to welcome one of the most remarkable pianists of our time, John O'Conor, an exceptional interpreter of the music of Beethoven."



Since unanimously winning first prize at the International Bee-

thoven Piano Competition in Vienna in 1973, O'Conor has toured the world in recital and concert appearances. His recordings, including the complete Beethoven Piano Concertos with the London Symphony Orchestra, have been met with great acclaim. O'Conor is also regarded as one of the most important piano teachers in the world today. He is deeply committed to the development of young pianists, giving masterclasses and lectures in many of the places he performs and in several major music institutions. O'Conor, a Steinway artist, currently holds positions as Distinguished Artist in Residence, Professor of Piano, Chair of the Keyboard Division, Shenandoah Conservatory in Virginia; Professor of Piano, Glenn Gould School of the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto; Distinguished Visiting Artist, Technical University of Dublin Conservatorie of Music; and Visiting Professor at Japan's Showa University. His students have won numerous international prizes and he continues to be in demand for masterclasses and as a juror at many prestigious international piano competitions worldwide.

Some of our LAS audience has already had the pleasure of experiencing O'Conor perform—at the Bankhead in 2019 at a Del Valle Fine Arts performance—and are most eager to hear him again on May 20! His now long-awaited performance with LAS was originally scheduled for 2021 until it became clear that the concert would be postponed due to the pandemic. In January of that year, O'Conor graciously recorded a conversation with Lara Webber, and, as a gift to our community and a prelude to his future performance with LAS, made a recording of three nocturnes. A special note of thanks to Linda Tinney, past LASA president and current LASA board and Guild member. She is credited with introducing O'Conor to our local arts community and to Lara Webber with the 2019 DVFA performance. This ultimately resulted in his upcoming appearance with LAS!

Plan to arrive at the concert in time for Lara's pre-concert talk, 7-7:30. Following the concert, all audience members and performers are invited to enjoy the post-concert reception hosted by the Guild. Don't miss it!

A Season to Remember !

As we approach our last concert of the season, *Drama and Fantasy, O'Conor Plays Beethoven* on May 20th, I'm reminded of how audacious this season's planning was. The September 10th Gala with **Ben Folds** was so challenging and joyful, and used every percussion instrument and player we have... Mr. Folds was highly complimentary of our orchestra as I was beaming in my seat!

Our October 15th *Pops On The Green* concert was so well attended on a beautiful afternoon in front of the Bankhead Theater! It showcased our symphony's versatility, the talents of high school jazz group Element 116, our conductor's infinite



charm with attending children to whom she gave a chance to step up onto the box and conduct our orchestra, and the work of our stalwart Symphony Guild, who made all of the arrangements under the guidance of chair **Linda Tinney** and raised \$1,000 in on-site donations collected from the crowd!

Our December 3rd *Family Concert*, with partner Valley Dance Theatre, was a fun element to a full day of Holiday family fun in downtown Livermore, which culminated in the delightful *Holiday Joy* concert that evening with the spectacular **Christopher Keady** organ performance in the Saint-Saëns Symphony No. 3. Well-played, all!

Then the ambitious February 5-6-7 *Violins of Hope* concerts, in partnership with the **East Bay Holocaust Education Center** and featuring terrific soloist **Lindsay Deutsch** and our own principal cellist **Peter Bedrossian**. The historic instruments of the Holocaust were played beautifully by our musicians, and soloists outdid themselves! But this was not just about the music; it included the video presentations highlighting the realities of the Jewish Holocaust, combined with personal reflections by family members, the instrument craftsmen who reconditioned the instruments, and the sponsors who shared their thoughts and cultural awareness for the audience. A truly memorable experience and a community treasure of an event!

Our April 1st *Kaleidoscopic Color and Spiritual Sound* concert featured the beautiful music of composers Arturo Marquez and Florence Price as well as featured winners of the Competition for Young Musicians. This was a particularly inspiring concert with music by ethnically diverse composers of different eras and performances by three excellent student musicians who experienced the thrill of playing with our symphony!

I'm excited to hear our orchestra join elite pianist **John O'Conor** on May 20th to complete our season with Mozart, Beethoven, Liadov and Stravinsky. Mostly, I'm extremely appreciative of the many talented musicians; hard-working Guild volunteers; loyal patrons; and especially our talented, enthusiastic, and beloved conductor, **Lara**, for a **"Season To Remember"** for all of us. Oh, and we've just endured three years of pandemic, with its effects on our health, cancelled concerts, masking, lost audiences, and lost revenues. We thank you for your patience, perseverance, and care for fellow musicians by masking. We trust that next season we'll be able to drop the masks along with other orchestras in the region if government regulations allow, fingers crossed! Our next season promises to be stellar, and I'm so glad we're moving forward together!
