Some Notes about the Concert

Lara Webber, Music Director and Conductor

The Symphony will perform a recently written work by **Lori Laitman**, one of today's most gifted composers. *Becoming a Redwood* is a song cycle about profound love and loss and finding wisdom and redemption in nature. The piece is set to poetry of **Dana Gioia**, who served as Chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts from 2003 to 2009 and California State Poet Laureate from 2015 to 2019. His poetry is emotional, cathartic and deeply inspiring, and plants us in the natural world. Laitman's expressive, evocative music is rooted in the text with musical lyricism that extends from the human voice with inevitability and eloquence. She draws with color and texture in her orchestration and finds warmth and nuanced expression in her harmonic language. We welcome tenor **Chad Somers**, one of the Bay Area's most sought-after singers, as our soloist. His vibrant, expressive voice is matched by his ability to connect intuitively and expressively to his audiences.

The concert opens with **Serenade in E-flat** by **Richard Strauss**, written by the composer at age 17. The marvelous LAS woodwinds are front and center for this piece! **Antonin Dvořák's Symphony No. 6** radiates with sunshine and joyful optimism. His music is full of memorable melodies, poignant tenderness, and boundless propulsive syncopated rhythms that carry us through to a glorious conclusion to our symphony season. We'll send you out singing! Please join us for the reception in the lobby following the concert.



Chad Somers, Tenor Soloist

Somers holds a Doctor of Musical Arts in Vocal Performance and Literature and Vocal Pedagogy from the Eastman School of Music. He is Adjunct Professor of Voice at San Joaquin Delta College and has a busy private studio in Lafayette. His students are known for their technical abilities and artistic expression. Somers seeks to "inspire genuine artistry and to uncover students' authentic voices to produce one-of-a-kind performances."

Somers continues to receive praise for his performances on the opera, concert, and recital stages. He has performed with many area opera companies, recently including Opera Parallèl and Pocket Opera in San Francisco, West Edge Opera in Oakland, Opera Modesto, and Livermore Valley Opera. (You may have seen his performance as Curley in LVO's production of *Of Mice and Men* at the Bankhead last October.) Other recent performances include appearances with Marin Symphony, Sacramento Choral and Orchestra Society, and Stockton Chorale and Symphony. In 2023 he performed in the premiere of *Becoming a Redwood* with Sonoma Philharmonic. Somers says, "Laitman's music has such a searching and human quality to match all the joy and despondency of Gioia's text which culminate to create a beautiful rumination on the human experience of love, loss and grief. [It is] a true joy to give it voice. I just love singing these songs!"

When not singing, you might find him hiking throughout Briones Regional Park with his wife and two children.

School Outreach Concerts in Dublin



A subset of the orchestra played at three concerts in Dublin on Thursday April 18, 2024: two at Amador Elementary School, followed by lunch for the orchestra in the school library provided by the Symphony Guild, and one at Green Elementary School.

Lara Webber introduced the instruments of the orchestra and each piece, with audience participation. The music created a world tour that began with the "Star-Spangled Banner" and included Mexico (excerpts from "Huapango" by Moncayo), China ("Saibei Dance" by Huang), Norway (the "Trolls' March" from Grieg's Lyric Suite), and some Beethoven and Dvořák before heading back to the U.S. for a Jurassic Park medley by John Williams.

Celestial Sounds May 31, 2025


